Learning Goals- Grade 6

1

Write mixed numbers as improper fractions and vice versa, and recognize the advantages and disadvantages of each representation.

Use multiple strategies to compare and order proper fractions, improper fractions, and mixed numbers, including the strategy of relating numerators and denominators.

Dec. 8th-17th-Numbers with Decimals-

Learning Goals-Gr 5

1

Extend place-value understanding to the hundredths place.

2

Count forward and backwards using decimal hundredths.

3

Represent decimal hundredths as fractions and fractions with denominators that are factors of 100 as decimal hundredths.

4

Represent money amounts involving dollars and cents.

Represent money amounts using decimal notation.

Learning Goals- Gr. 6

Relate decimal hundredths to simple fractions.

Relate the thousandths place in the place-value system to the tenths and hundredths places.

Use decimal thousandths to describe measurements.

Represent decimal thousandths in many ways that tell different things about the decimal.

Write fractions as decimals, whether repeating or terminating decimals, and round the result.

Numeracy (characteristics of number & basic facts) are continuous throughout the year and spiral throughout other math concepts.

Language writing- Descriptive Language- "showing not telling with rich sensory language and Christmas/Winter imagery. Students will co-construct a checklist of successful criteria. If time allows we will also describe a gingerbread house.

Gym and Health- We have been improving our volleyball skills of serving, bumping, volleying and working on a team with control. In

Health, we are working on using our w.I.T.S. and dealing positively with stress.
